The contents of this document are Tomahawk's best forecast for next summer. As the pandemic changes, we will continue to work to maximize program opportunities while ensuring health and safety.

PAYMENT TIMELINE

- 1. \$100.00 non-refundable campsite deposit made at time of the reservation.
- 2. \$25.00 per Scout deposit (non-refundable) due on or before April 15th.
- 3. Full Camper Fee Payment is due on June 1st, prior to camp.

Any incidentals incurred at camp will be due upon checkout.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

For Scouts who are not able to afford the full fee of camp, there is financial support available. This assistance is like a scholarship for camp. We call these camperships. The funds to provide camperships are supplied by donors in Northern Star Council and are ear-marked for Northern Star Scouts only.

If you or families in your unit need assistance to make camp more affordable, please review the financial assistance page online for more information. Just search "campership" on the Tomahawk website.

EQUIPMENT

We have canvas wall tents, canvas cover cots, and canvas tarps available to troops. Troops are allowed to bring their own tents and dining flies.



SCHEDULE

MORNING (ADVANCEMENT TIME)

In the morning, Scouts work on merit badges in classes scheduled in the form of "Blocks". There are four blocks in the morning (see below).

AFTERNOON (TROOP/CREW TIME)

In the afternoon, the Troop or Crew participates in activities as a group. Preferences are submitted in the advance staff develop a schedule for you.

EVENING (OPEN TIME)

After supper Scouts explore camp with their buddy or patrol. Swim at the beach, climb the tower, or go to the shooting ranges! *Activities may be scheduled out in 2021*

Take a swing at the forge and make a mini-tomahawk, or use the two-person saws to cut a wood cookie that you can brand with the blacksmiths. You can even become best friends with a goat!

Personalize a mug, water bottle, or wood cookie by branding it with one of our many branding irons.

Explore the log cabin, originally constructed before the Civil War.

Scouts older than 14 can use the lever action .22 rifle and double-barreled shotgun at the camp shootin' range.

At the end the day, spend the evening around the fire with a hearty bowl of chili and listen to the tall tales and music of the Knapp Stout loggers.

1st YEAR CAMPER: BROWNSEA

A SKILL-FOCUSED PROGRAM BASED IN FUN!

The Brownsea program, geared towards first-time campers, is an exposure-based program to the outdoor skills needed for advancement in Scouting. Scouts will explore every area of camp, learning Scouting's most essential skills along the way! Tomahawk's Brownsea program is known for its activity-based learning and use of small patrols.

WHAT DO I EARN?

- Second Class 1b, 2a, 2b, 2c, 2f,
 2g, 3a, 3c, 3d, 4, 5a, 5b, 5c, 5d,
 6a, 6b, 6c
- First Class: 1b, 4a, 5b, 5c, 5d,
 6b, 6e, 7a, 7b, 7c
- Though Brownsea teaches these skills, it is the duty of the unit leaders or troop guides to signoff on the requirements.

ADULT LEADER SUPPORT

At least one leader from each unit with Scouts enrolled in the Brownsea program should attend alongside the Scouts to help with instruction, organization and skill testing.

SAILING PROGRAMS

Cruise around Long Lake in camp's largest sail boat! Sit back and relax while an aquatics staff captains and teaches you a bit about sailing.

TIER 1: SMALL-BOAT SAILING MB

Sailing is available at every beach. Sailing Merit Badge is everyday from 2pm-4pm. If you have a conflict with another program you may miss a day and make up the work during evening program.

TIER 2: WIND SURFING

Earn sail-boarding BSA in this challenging sailing activity. Wind surfing is physically demand and fun!

Catamarans are the fastest sailboat on the lake. They cut through the water and scream across the lake.

Camp will transport the canoes and gear and assist with shuttling vehicles. Adult leaders will need to transport Scouts to the launch point. Adults may also participate.
